<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination</li> <li>• Play competitive games, modified where appropriate and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending</li> <li>• Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance</li> <li>• Compare their performances with previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve their personal best.</li> </ul>		
<b>Year 4</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Throw accurately underarm at a target from a stationary position</li> <li>• Throw accurately overarm at a target from a station position</li> <li>• Begin to throw and catch while under pressure in a game situation</li> <li>• Use fielding skills to stop a ball effectively e.g. Travelling along the floor</li> <li>• Develop techniques for controlling a bat</li> <li>• Develop techniques for striking a ball off a tee with accuracy</li> <li>• Develop teamwork and communication during runs</li> </ul>	<p>AS (1): I can throw a ball with increasing accuracy</p> <p>AS (2): I can hold a bat correctly with the correct foot position.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Throw accurately underarm at a target from a moving position</li> <li>• Throw accurately overarm at a target from a moving position</li> <li>• Accurately throw and catch while under pressure in a game situation</li> <li>• Begin to understand the mechanics of bowling</li> <li>• Use a bat with increasing control</li> <li>• Develop an understanding of the different ways to strike a ball that has been drop fed</li> <li>• Develop teamwork and communication when batting</li> <li>• Start to understand how to umpire a game of cricket</li> <li>• Start keep score in a game of cricket</li> </ul>	<p>AS (1): I can bat a ball with increasing accuracy</p> <p>AS (2): I can develop communication and teamwork when fielding</p>

<p><b>Year 6</b></p> <p><b>Celebration of skills</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Develop strategies for catching that ensure team success (e.g. cushioning a ball)</li><li>● Strike the ball with a cross bat (hook shot) and apply other learnt batting techniques to game play</li><li>● Begin to bowl with line and length</li><li>● Link together throwing and catching skills and use in combination during simulated play and in a game situation</li><li>● Use good teamwork and communication skills to ensure team success in batting and fielding</li></ul> <p><b><i>Tactical Approaches and Rules</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Demonstrate tactics for defending, both whilst fielding and batting</li><li>● Demonstrate tactics for attacking, both whilst fielding and batting</li><li>● Demonstrate good teamwork and communication skills to ensure team success in batting and fielding</li><li>● Explain how some aspects of fitness apply to cricket e.g. power, flexibility and cardiovascular endurance</li><li>● Demonstrate ability to evaluate the performance of self and others, including discussing how tactics in batting and fielding could be adapted for optimum success</li></ul>	<p>AS (1): I can tactically place a ball with the aim to score highly when batting</p> <p>AS (2): I can optimise communication and teamwork when applying fielding tactics</p>
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
